



Bob Gaudio and Judy Parker co-wrote "December, 1963 (Oh, What A Night)," "Silver Star," "Who Loves You" and five other tunes for The Four Seasons' LP, "Who Loves You."

BOB GAUDIO'S writing and producing talents have been a major force contributing to The Four Seasons' enormous popularity and success. From the group's formation in 1961 to 1971, Bob was not only a performing member of The Four Seasons, but was also the co-writer/producer of such major hits as "Sherry," "Big Girls Don't Cry," "Walk Like A Man," "Dawn" and "Rag Doll." He also wrote "Can't Take My Eyes Off Of You," which was one of Frankie Valli's first big solo hits.

Bob now devotes all of his time to writing and producing, and although most of his work is still done with Frankie Valli and The Four Seasons, he has worked with Frank Sinatra and Diana Ross and his songs have been recorded by the Bay City Rollers ("Bye, Bye Baby"), the Tremelos ("Silence Is Golden"), the Walker Brothers ("The Sun Ain't Gonna Shine Anymore") and the Osmond Brothers ("Proud One").
